UPCOMING EVENT

On 27 September, UN Secretary General will host a high-level event on polio eradication, in the margins of the UN General Assembly in New York. The event, 'Our Commitment to the Next Generation: The Legacy of a Polio-free World' will bring together leaders of the remaining endemic countries, donor aovernments. development agencies, partners and media, to draw attention to the urgent need for focus and commitment to eradicate the remaining 1% of polio cases worldwide.

The event will be followed by a global civil society festival on 29 September, bringing together top artists with an audience of 60,000 to a concert in New York's Central Park, to catalyse further action to end polio.

GLOBAL POLIO UPDATE

In 2012 so far, 145 cases have been reported globally from four countries - Nigeria (88), Pakistan (35), Afghanistan (17) and Chad (5). This compares to 400 cases reported from 15 countries for the corresponding period in 2011
